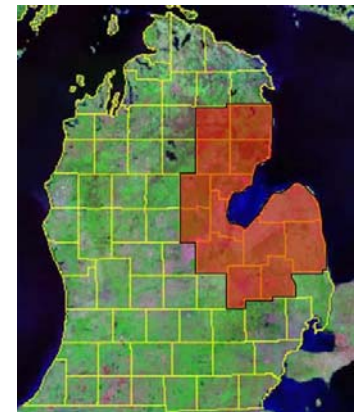

Purpose

The Regional Trauma Symposium offers healthcare workers an overview of common injury patterns in the trauma patient and assessment and interventions in the management of several specific injuries.

Objectives

- Describe common mechanisms of injury that may result in bony, ligamentous or vascular injuries in the neck.
- Compare and contrast the epidemiology, anatomy, spinal stability and immobilization of the spinal column between blunt and penetrating trauma.
- Prioritize the interventions across the continuum of care for the patient with an unstable pelvic fracture.
- Describe the impact of anti-platelet therapy on decision making in trauma care.
- Discuss the effectiveness of On-Star communication with prehospital providers and how it relates to the Emergency Department response to prehospital radio calls.
